



Eamonn Kelly is an Assistant Secretary General in Ireland's Department of Transport with responsibility for Maritime Transport Policy and he advises Ireland's Minister for Transport and the Department's Secretary General.

Eamonn is Director General of the Irish Maritime Administration, and his sectoral responsibilities include the regulation of Irish ships and crew; the inspection of foreign flagged ships and crews in Irish ports; governance of Ireland's commercial state port companies; and leading on research, development and implementation of climate change mitigation and adaptation policies for the maritime sector.

Eamonn qualified as a Solicitor in 2003 and as a Chartered Town Planner in 2005 and he holds a Bachelor of Civil Law Degree, a Master's Degree in European Law, a Master's Degree in Regional and Urban Planning, all from University College Dublin, and a Diploma in Company Direction from the Institute of Directors. Eamonn has also studied at the University of Oxford's Blavatnik School of Government. He joined the civil service over a decade ago, having worked in both private and public sectors for fifteen years beforehand. He was appointed as Assistant Secretary General and Member of the Department of Transport's Management Board in 2023 and he presently sits on the Department's Audit Committee.
