



Ms Sellier is currently Head of the Maritime Safety Unit of the Directorate-General for Mobility and Transport in the European Commission.

The unit strives to develop and implement policies and legislation for the promotion of quality shipping and for the prevention of accidents and pollution caused by ships. It leads on global work to reduce GHG emissions from ships. It deals with all aspects of ships' safety, safety of passengers and crews, the training and certification of seafarers, and working conditions on board ships; it promotes the technological development of vessel traffic monitoring; and it looks after flag and port State responsibilities, and the role of classification societies. The unit also coordinates the Commission's relations with the International Maritime Organisation and oversees the Commission's relations with the European Maritime Safety Agency.

Ms Sellier joined the European Commission in 2004 and has since held different positions in the field of transport and energy. She has been working in maritime affairs since 2013. She graduated from the Paris Institute of Political Studies and holds a Master in Modern History and a Master in Development.
